- 1) Begin your time by briefly praying and asking the Holy Spirit to help you as you discuss and study.
- 2) Read Luke 10:1-12 together.
- 3) What stuck out to you as you read? Is there anything you don't understand? Is there anything you'd like to discuss?
- 4) What is the significance of Jesus sending out these seventy-two people in groups of two?
- 5) What can we learn about missions from verse 2?
- 6) Why would Jesus send his people out "as lambs in the midst of wolves?"
- 7) Part of the significance of verses 4-8 is that Jesus is commanding us to be more dependent on his provision than we are dependent on our own power to provide for our needs. Why is this hard for us?
- 8) In verses 9-12 the reality of denying the gospel is made explicitly clear. Is it hard for you to believe in the judgment of God? Why or why not?
- 9) The gospel is good news, but denying the gospel bears a consequence. How do we share this message in a way that makes sense to the world?
- 10) Who are the people in your life that God is sending you to minister to? Have you had the chance to share the gospel with them?
- 11) End your time in prayer. Ask God to help you apply the things you've discussed and learned during this time of study.
