- 1) Begin your time by briefly praying and asking the Holy Spirit to help you as you discuss and study.
- 2) Read these passages and make a list of the main points that stick out: Matthew 4:17-20, Matthew 28:18-20, John 20:19-21, 2 Corinthians 5:17-20.
- 3) In John 20:19-21, Jesus says that "as the Father sent me, so know I'm sending you." What are the ways in which Jesus was sent? How does this inform the way that we are being sent?
- 4) In 2 Corinthians 5:17-20, the Apostle Paul tells believers that they are ambassadors. Think about a US Ambassador to another country. What does this person do? How does this help you understand what it means to be an ambassador for Christ?
- 5) As you think about missions, how does God move in your heart and mind? What might God be calling you to do?
- 6) Read these passages and make a list of the main points that stick out: Luke 24:46-47, Acts 1:8, Matthew 24:14, Revelation 5:9-10.
- 7) Do you ever picture christianity as only a Western religion? Why is this not true?
- 8) Reflect and Respond to this quote from David Platt:

"A person who is a part of an unreached people group is in a different situation than your non-Christian family, friends, and neighbors. It's not simply that they don't believe the gospel or that they haven't heard it explained clearly, as unfortunate as that is. It's that they don't even have access to a Christian or a church that could share the gospel with them. Practically speaking, they will be born, live, die, and go to hell without ever hearing about who Jesus is and what he has done to provide forgiveness and eternal life."

- 9) Read Romans 10:9-17 together.
- 10) What stuck out to you as you read this passage?

- 11) Being a good neighbor is really important, but it's not evangelism. Why is this true based on Romans 10:9-17?
- 12) End your time in prayer. Ask God to help you apply the things you've discussed and learned during this time of study.
