

- 1) Begin your time by briefly praying and asking the Holy Spirit to help you as you discuss and study.
- 2) Read John 19:39-20:18 together.
- 3) What stuck out to you as you read? Is there anything you don't understand? Is there anything you'd like to discuss?
- 4) If the resurrection is true, where should it be on the list of important events in history? Why?
- 5) How has your life changed through belief in the resurrection?
- 6) How do your Sunday gatherings celebrate and remind you of the resurrection?
- 7) Why does John mention the grave clothes left in the tomb?
- 8) How does the resurrection free us from the fear of death in day-to-day life?
- 9) What impact does freedom from fear of death have on the way you spend your money and use your free time?
- 10) How can you approach God in prayer as his child?
- 11) What has God promised to his children?
- 12) If the resurrection had never happened, would your life be any different? Explain.
- 13) End your time in prayer. Ask God to help you apply the things you've discussed and learned during this time of study.
