- 1) Begin your time by briefly praying and asking the Holy Spirit to help you as you discuss and study.
- 2) Read Romans 10:9-17 together.
- 3) What stuck out to you as you read? Is there anything you don't understand? Is there anything you'd like to discuss?
- 4) According to verses 9 and 10, what does someone need to do to be saved?
- 5) In verse 10, Paul says that someone believes and is "justified." What does the word "justified" mean?
- 6) What are some of the false things that others say is necessary for salvation?
- 7) Do you count it a privilege to be part of the way that God saves people? How does that motivate you to "preach"?
- 8) How could you have "beautiful feet," sharing good news today?
- 9) Do you ever find yourself making excuses for "good people" who have rejected the gospel message? How do Paul's words about his own people challenge you?
- End your time in prayer. Ask God to help you apply the things you've discussed and learned during this time of study.
