- Begin your time by briefly praying and asking the Holy Spirit to help you as you discuss and study.
- 2) Read John 13:1-30 together.
- 3) What stuck out to you as you read? Is there anything you don't understand? Is there anything you'd like to discuss?
- 4) How would you respond if Jesus were to wash your feet?
- 5) Why is Jesus's washing the feet of his disciples not a denial of his character as Master?
- 6) Do you find it hard to serve people you view as undeserving? What are some excuses you make?
- 7) Would you have washed Judas's feet? Why does Jesus?
- 8) What are some ways you can show loving service to fellow believers through inconvenience?
- 9) Describe the significance of the words "just as" to the Christian life (v. 15).
- 10) How is the focus of this passage desire rather than duty?
- 11) What is Jesus teaching his disciples by washing their feet?
- 12) How is humble service a picture of the gospel to an unbelieving world?
- 13) How does Jesus show us a different path than religion?
- 14) How does Judas's betrayal give us confidence in Jesus?
- 15) Why did Jesus choose Judas to be one of his disciples?
- 16) Why does Jesus prophesy Judas's betrayal and tell his disciples of its necessity before it happened?

- 17) How does this passage demonstrate Jesus's power over Satan?
- 18) End your time in prayer. Ask God to help you apply the things you've discussed and learned during this time of study.
